AWARENESS SPEECH BY PROF.DR.R.SHANKAR, DEPT. OF COMMUNITY MEDICINE

Dr. R.Shankar, Professor, Department of Community Medicine, addressed the gathering at the Attayampatti Rural health Centre regarding vector borne diseases. Facts about the disease along with the main source, modes of spread, signs and symptoms were explained in detail. Special emphasis was made on measures to be taken to prevent the spread of the disease i.e. avoiding collection and stagnation of water in artificial sources, usage of mosquito nets and repellants. Around 25 residents of the nearby villages were benefitted by the speech. This programme served as a tool to understand the public perception of the disease and to help create awareness among them.
